Gala Deloris Starling March 2, 1938 – January 7, 2022



MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS SERVICES

- 622 Calls required face-to-face response
- 665 Individuals were provided with support over the crisis hotline
- 126 Calls required referrals to other services
- 52 Calls required immediate response by law enforcement.

The Mobile Crisis Response Teams (M-CeRT) funding provides community-based crisis services that deliver solution-focused and recovery-oriented behavioral health assessments and stabilization of crises in the location where the individual is experiencing the crises. Without mobile crisis intervention, the individual experiencing the crisis may be inappropriately and unnecessarily placed in a jail, holding facility, hospital or inpatient treatment facility.

Warren Yazoo Behavioral Health **Enhanced Crisis** services offer the community a no-wrong-door access to mental health services and provides actual emergency department and justice system diversion.

Children's services at Warren Yazoo Behavioral Health helps keep families growing together, by providing a network of services and programs.

TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE

The provision of transportation services helps consumers to have access to medically necessary care. The agency receives funds to cover a portion of capital costs for vehicles purchased through contracts with the MS Department of Transportation. The agency also has contracts with N-Route Transit System in Warren County and Bolivar County Council on Aging in Yazoo County to provide transportation.
